

Dear 4-H Families

You are Invited....

One of the Essential Elements of 4-H is **Belonging**. Creating a welcoming atmosphere in our clubs nurtures self-worth and signals to the youth: "You matter! You're in the right place!" It helps them connect to the other people in the group and gives them a feeling of ownership in it.

One key to establishing a welcoming atmosphere is to make sure previous "owners" of a group are willing to change their habits. A familiar game or activity may need to be slowed down for a little while to give new youth a chance to learn it. Perhaps a new face comes with ideas for new way of doing something different than "what we've always done". Most importantly, a group needs to be prepared to leave its social comfort zone to make room for new friendships. It can be very easy to hang out with long-time buddies and forget to include new people.

Being aware of group dynamics will help us make sure everyone feels like they belong. But before they can belong, they have to be invited! Afterschool and SPIN clubs are starting up. *Did you know youth can be a part of both community and afterschool clubs?* Please invite K-5th graders to join afterschool clubs by enrolling on 4HOnline and picking their school's club. (Details inside.)

Belonging is important for adults as well! On October 17th we had our first annual Charter Renewal Party, a chance for club leaders to come together and exchange ideas while filling in some paperwork. We met at VIP Pizza for dinner and almost half of our clubs were represented. Some paperwork was completed, but most of our time was spent visiting. Leaders shared their thoughts on different aspects of Douglas County 4-H, asked questions, and some great brainstorming occurred. I greatly appreciate the feedback and look forward to more events like this for our leaders and volunteers!

Re-enrollments are due to the Extension office by **Dec. 31**. New enrollments are due by **May 1**. Project changes (drops & adds) must be made by **May 1**. 4-H'ers enrolling after these dates will not be eligible to show at the Fair unless approved by the Executive Board.
