Suggestions for 2018 WAHCE International District and County Chairs

During my term as WAHCE International Chair, I am working with some very dedicated people to continue with the many projects that we have been involved with in the past several years. Pennies for Friendship monies can be sent in as undesignated, or you can designate where you would like those monies to be used.

The following are suggestions as to how you might designate your monies to be used.

- Support and promote the W/NP: Each county should have received a list of the most needed items such as cotton fabric, heavier fabric such as denim or duck for making back packs and tote bags, zippers, buttons, sewing needles both machine and hand, yarn and crochet cotton. You can also donate money for the stove project or just W/NP wok in general.
- Support the NVON Water Around the World project (water filters). Right now they are costing just \$18.00 per filter. The money goes a long way.
- Support the Ventures in People Scholarship project.

Then, the committee has suggested that we do the 25 cent per person collection again this year. The money this year will go to the new "Learning Center" project for classes for adult women in Haiti. They have almost no opportunities to learn and there are many things they could learn to better the health and wellbeing of their families. With this year's money, \$450 has been set aside for classes. I will keep you posted as to what classes they are having and how we expect it will help these women. What the UPDATE!

Just mark this donation as the "25 cent project" when you send it in. That will make sure we can continue the classes for at least another year.

This comes from the International Committee with approval of the state board. Thank you for all of your cooperation the past years. Through you we have done much very good work. We have made a difference in the world, our state, and our own communities. Thanks for your cooperation.

EARTH DAY 2018

We only have one earth, so we need to take care of her. That's what Senator **Gaylord Nelson** of Wisconsin believed. After witnessing the ravages of the 1969 massive oil spill in Santa Barbara, California. Inspired by the student anti-war movement, he realized that if he could infuse that energy with an emerging public consciousness about air and water pollution, it would force environmental protection onto the national political agenda. He was disturbed that an issue as important as our environment was not addressed in politics or by the media, so he created the first Earth Day, on April 22, 1970.

The emphasis for Earth Day 2018 is plastics in our environment. The invention of plastic in 1907 was considered a breakthrough. Plastic products soon became omnipresent in our daily lives. For many years, we only perceived the benefits of plastic and knew little of the damaging consequences for human health, natural ecosystems and the climate. Plastics are a problem mostly due to their un-biodegradable nature, the materials used for plastic production (hydrocarbon molecules—derived from the refining of oil and natural gas) and the environmental effects of manufacture, and the challenges behind properly discarding them.

Please do your best to: **REDUCE, REFUSE, REUSE, RECYCLE, REMOVE** plastics from your life! Find more information and things you can do at www.earthday.org.

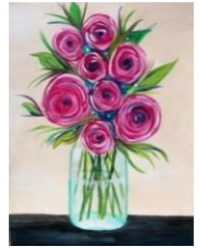
