<u>Human Development & Relationships Educator – Tracy Henegar:</u> no report




THANK YOU

## THE HCE CLUBS OF DOUGLAS COUNTY WERE BUSY IN 2018—JUST LOOK!

### (Report to Update by Sue Hendrickson and Mary Ann Gronquist)

**FEB**.: First board meeting of 2018 at the Guadalajara Restaurant, Superior, owned and run by a Mexican family. Program followed. Sampled ethnic foods and the owner shared the story of the restaurant; then we planned our International event for HCE week. A survey of members chose Iceland, so articles on the country will be run in the Dispatch, our monthly newsletter.

MAR.: Annual Quiltathon at Mariner Mall and Business Center, Superior. Mall lets us set up for the day at no cost; much of the fabric is donated by local fabric stores and local folks joined members to assemble about 100 children's quilts for local family service agencies. Batting cost is supplemented by proceeds from a quilt raffle—quilt is made and donated by a talented member. Donations for Nicaragua were collected, and delivered to Steven's Point by an independent member and former Family Living Educator.

**APR**.: Board meeting included a brainstorming session for ideas for a program-planning survey from which members choose topics of interest for next year's activities. Members attended Spring District Meeting. Saturday Craft Day was held at a local church to accommodate working members in HCE and the community, and Cultural Arts Contest was held there.



**MAY**: Tour of Epicurean factory. A new, very green business in Superior that produces utensils, cutting boards and lawn furniture from a hardy composite also used in skateboard parks. Lunch followed at a local restaurant, and bylaws were reviewed at the board meeting that followed.

**JULY**: Public Relations booth at Head of the Lakes Fair; information shared, raffle tickets sold and demonstrated a new way of tying fleece blankets. Northland Independent Living, a support agency for the disabled, invited us to set up a similar display at their day-long health Expo at the Mall.

**SEPT**.: Annual Craft Sale planned at board meeting. President attended state conference and brought twelve entries down for state Cultural Arts Contest.

**OCT**.: Craft Sale held; 60-70 local crafters, no commercial sales, pay modest fee to rent a table at the Head of the Lakes Fairgrounds; profits fund a \$500 scholarship to a student at University of Wisconsin—Superior or Wisconsin Indianhead Technical School, both in Superior.

**NOV**.: Final program-planning at board meeting with white elephant sale; members invited. International event during HCE week—Iceland program by HCE member who had visited there, and a selection of Icelandic foods.

**DEC**.: Annual holiday gathering at a local supper club that opens on a Tuesday night just for us. Members and guests enjoyed a good meal and entertainment. Tickets were sold for donated raffle prizes and over \$500 were raised to purchase gift cards for low-income seniors. Donations were collected for a food basket for a needy family.

#### YOUR GREEN TIPS FOR FEBRUARY:

Are your appliances wasting money? The average Wisconsin homeowner spends about \$500 per year on electricity for appliances and electronics. To reduce their use and save money:

- Locate refrigerators and freezers in a cool, dry space. If they are near a heat source, such as the range/oven, or in sunlight, they will work harder and cost more.
- Set refrigerator at 36-40 degrees F and freezer at 0-5 degrees F to keep food fresh and equipment operating efficiently.
- Defrost freezer regularly, if manual, Don't allow more than ¼
   " of frost build-up.
- Vacuum any exposed coils on refrigerator regularly, especially if you have pets.
- A second refrigerator can waste energy and cost from \$60-180 extra a year. When not in use, unplug second refrigerator or freezer and block the door open for safety.

HCE members and guests are invited to attend a make and take essential oils workshop presented by Jennifer Robb. Jennifer has enjoyed making many of her recipes using the oils for quite a few years and would like to share a few ideas with you. Essential oils are more powerful than you might think. They're wonderful natural healers. You can use aromatherapy remedies to support your health simply by using essential oils for the right problem at the right time. The fee for this class is \$5.00 - to be brought to the class.

Option #1 is a Solid Lotion Bar made with 4 ingredients, Coconut Oil, Beeswax, Shea Butter, and Essential oils. To form your bar you may bring a mold of your own, or use one provided at the workshop. Multiple oils will be available.

Option #2 is a Bath/Foot Soak made with 4 ingredients, Epsom Salt, Sea Salt, Baking Soda, and Essential Oils. Multiple oils will be available. You may bring a jar with a lid of your own that will hold at least 2 cups, or use one provided.
